Medicaid for Workers with Disabilities

Who is Eligible

In order to be eligible, individuals must meet the following criteria:

- At least 16, but under 65
- Disabled as defined by Social Security
- Working or self-employed
- Income and resources must not exceed defined limits (see box at right)

What you might have to pay

You may have to pay premiums based on your income level. See the box at the right to determine the premium amount you pay based on your income.



Income Limits

- If applying as an individual, you may be eligible if your monthly income is less than \$4,085.
- If applying as a couple, you may be eligible if your monthly income is less than \$5,500.

Resource Limits*

- If applying as an individual, you may be eligible if your resources are less than \$10,000.
- If applying as a couple, you may be eligible if your resources are less than \$15,000.

** Your home, up to two vehicles, and any retirement accounts do not count toward the resource limit.*

Premium Amounts

If applying as an individual, and your monthly income is:

- \$1,086 or less, your monthly premium will be \$0.
- \$1,087 to \$2,043, your monthly premium will be \$10.
- \$2,044 to \$4,085, your monthly premium will be \$10 to \$153 depending on your level of income.

If applying as a couple, and your monthly income is:

- \$1,463 or less, your monthly premium will be \$0.
- \$1,464 to \$2,750, your monthly premium will be \$10.
- \$2,751 to \$5,500, your monthly premium will be \$10 to \$153 depending on your level of income.
