What is UDL?

UDL is a set of principles for curriculum development that give all individuals equal opportunities to learn. UDL is now part of Federal legislation (ESSA, IDEA, Federal grants, The National Technical Center, etc.).

UDL provides a blueprint for creating instructional goals, methods, materials, and assessments that work for everyone – not a single one-size-fits-all solution, but rather flexible approaches that can be customized and adjusted for individual needs.


Why is UDL Necessary?

Individuals bring a huge variety of skills, needs, and interests to learning. Neuroscience reveals that these differences are as varied and unique as our DNA or fingerprints. Three primary brain networks come into play.
