


Proposed Medicaid Budget Cuts

A global pandemic is not the time to cut health care to citizens. Idahoans, more than ever, need the health care assistance that Medicaid provides.

Background

• Medicaid provides almost <u>400,000</u> Idahoans access to healthcare.



- Medicaid Expansion provides healthcare to <u>95,000</u> Idaho adults.
 Many have lost jobs during COVID-19 and have unmet medical conditions.
 In Fiscal Year 2022:
 - Traditional Medicaid is projected to cost the state **\$1.1 B**
 - Medicaid expansion is projected to cost the state \$90 M

COVID-19 federal relief dollars offset costs and allow flexibility in how services are provided. In Fiscal Year 2021:

- Strong revenues: \$630 M surplus
- Federal aid: \$9 B to Idaho
- Increased FMAP: +105 M to Idaho



The Idaho Division of Medicaid is required by law to return surplus funds back to the state general fund.

Issue

• The Idaho Legislature is seeking to contain costs in the Medicaid budget. Medicaid presented to the Joint Finance and Appropriations Committee (JFAC) three possible ways to cut **\$30** million from the state budget.



Reduce Rates

- Providers like doctors, dentists, behavioral health clinicians, and those who do not rely solely on Medicaid
- Does not include Home and Community Based Services providers paid by Medicaid to support people with disabilities



 Adult dental health, adult podiatry, adult chiropractic services, and weight management practices



 Increase provider taxes to hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, and ICF/ID's
