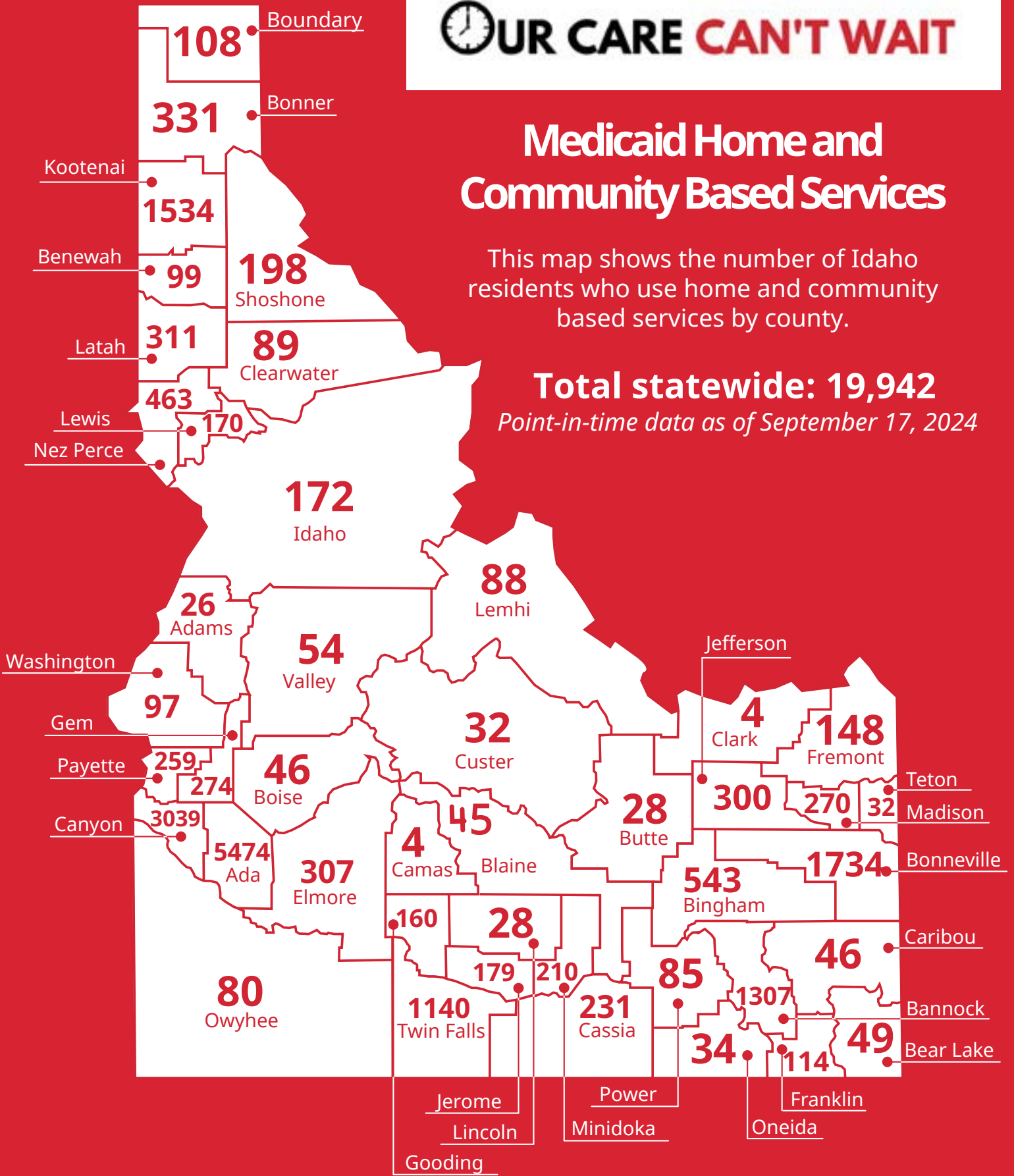


Medicaid Home and Community Based Services

The Our Care Can't Wait Coalition asked Medicaid for the number of people eligible for Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) through Idaho's two adult and the children's waiver programs. We asked for that number by county, and in mid-September 2024, the total was 19,942. That number includes children with disabilities, adults with disabilities, and older individuals who received services through the Aged and Disabled, Developmental Disabilities, or Children's Medicaid waivers.

The OPE report identified 33,000 individuals who received services in 2021 based on billing claims that Medicaid providers filed related to direct care. The people who received those services included children with disabilities, adults with disabilities, and older individuals who receive the waiver services captured in the 2024 count. The 2021 figure cited by the OPE report includes people who received behavioral health services and state plan services, which are also community-based but not necessarily included in our 2024 county-by-county count (or data).
